Two experienced guides including a Battle of Britain historian will take visitors on a tour of Middle Wallop airfield where once "Cats Eyes" Cunningham flew by night and Spitfires and Hurricanes departed to engage Goring's Luftwaffe by day...

Middle Wallop, where night fighting tactics were developed, still has its original wartime layout with Grass Runways; Pickett-Hamilton Retractable Fort; Pill Boxes; Type C Hangers; Perimeter Track with Keyhole Hardstands and OC No. 609 Squadron's Airfield Bungalow!

The walk will finish with a period lunch at "The Five Bells", Nether Wallop - a favourite haunt of wartime fighter pilots and used as a Mess by No.609 Squadron.
